

BASED ON RESEARCH

- » MBF Prevention Education Programs are comprehensive, evidence-based/ evidence-informed programs based on polyvictimization research. All programs teach universal Safety Rules and strategies that apply to many types of victimization.
- » *MBF Child Safety Matters*® has been found to be a quality and effective program by four independent research studies; other MBF programs are based on the same theoretical concepts and the same best-practice prevention strategies ensuring their effectiveness. MBF is committed to ongoing evaluation of all programs.
- » Programs are trauma informed, age- and developmentally appropriate, and incorporate social-emotional learning competencies, use active learning strategies, and provide skills practice opportunities for youth.



PRACTICAL FOR SCHOOLS/ORGANIZATIONS

- » Programs are cost effective and easy for schools and organizations to implement using standardized curricula with facilitator scripts and PowerPoint presentations.
- » Lessons can be implemented by a variety of professionals, such as school counselors, teachers, health educators, nurses, coaches, and local community partners such as child advocacy centers.
- » Facilitators are trained prior to implementing program lessons via live or online training options.
- » Programs include reinforcement materials for children/teens, parents/guardians, and schools/ organizations.

MBF Teen Safety Matters® – Middle and High School Curriculum

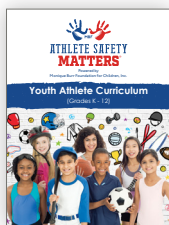
- » For students in grades six through twelve

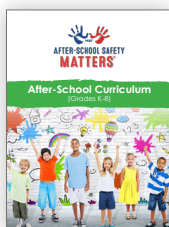
